

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

In the last edition of the journal, I mentioned that Mark Jusselin and his committee (Tim Allen, Rhaoul Guillaume, and Ali Mustapha) were developing Disciplinary and Enforcement Sanction Guidelines. Over time, various kinds of violations of Board Rules and Laws were brought before the board by our enforcement personnel. On reviewing board enforcement actions, we found the board was not always consistent in penalties and other sanctions. Mr. Jusselin's committee developed and the board has adopted LAPELS' Disciplinary and Enforcement Sanction Guidelines for Consent Orders and sanctions being issued during enforcement deliberations. Among other things, the document provides guidance on sanctions depending on whether the violation was a first offense, a minor or major infraction, and how long the violation activity continued. Among the violations covered, but not limited to, are the following: "Practicing with an Expired License, Failure to respond to a CPD Audit, Criminal Convictions, and Misuse of Seals by a Licensee. The Guidelines provide for consistent handling of fines, incurred costs, whether or not a violator is required to inform clients of the transgression and whether the individual or firm's name is to be published. Having and using documented guidelines ensures that enforcement is consistent and fair.

Following that message, we continue to get returned mail (renewal notices, Journals, etc.) from licensees. After the devastating storms Louisiana experienced in 2005, it is understandable that we would experience some missing addresses. However, we must remind all that as a licensee, it is the licensee's responsibility to notify the board office of any address changes. By doing so, late renewals can be avoided and journals and other board communications can be received in a timely fashion.

One other enforcement related issue, the Department of Health and Hospitals (DHH) has met with us regarding abuses from engineering firms providing engineering services to developers of subdivisions for utilities, particularly water and sewers. DHH cites a number of firms who have repeatedly been late

with submitting completed plans for water and wastewater infrastructure and those who do not provide DHH adequate review time before actually beginning construction of these utilities. DHH is considering filing formal complaints with the LAPELS Board for the offending firms.

Finally, I want to commend two of our board members, Mr. Richard Durrett and Dr. Ken McManis on the completion of their appointments to the board at the end of March. Mr. Durrett and Dr. McManis both served two terms as board officers and contributed many hours of their personal time for the betterment of engineering and surveying in Louisiana. Thanks, Richard and Ken. As you recall, last year the legislature changed the expiration date of board members' terms from August 31st to March 31st of the following year. This change impacted the sitting board members only and beginning with their replacements, new board member terms are set to go from March 31st of the appointment year for a period of 6 years.

<u>PLINARY AND ENFORCEMENT ACTIO</u>

id you know? The Board authorized the hiring of a part-time investigator to assist in the enforcement matters. Mr. Benjamin S. Harrison, the former Director of Enforcement, was hired to fill this position.

The Board conducted an audit of the April 1, 2006 renewal cycle, which was completed since the last issue of the Journal. There were 140 audit notices mailed to licensees who renewed in the referenced cycle

The Enforcement Section of the Board continues to remain very busy. The types of matters being addressed are heavily weighted toward the offering and/or providing of engineering or land surveying services on an expired license, with the remainder of the matters involving unlicensed practice, plan stamping, property boundary survey issues, and negligence or competency issues. Those matters for which disciplinary/enforcement action has been completed since the last issue of the Journal are reported below.

PRACTICE OF ENGINEERING AND/OR LAND **SURVEYING ON AN EXPIRED LICENSE**

Mr. Brian M. Vance, P.E., a non-resident Louisiana licensee, was disciplined by the Board for the offering and/ or providing of engineering services in Louisiana during the period that his license was in an expired status from April 1, 2004 until October 26, 2005 in violation of La. R.S. 37:698(A)(9) and (16). Mr. Vance's license has been renewed, and he has entered into a Consent Order with the Board, wherein he admitted to an unintentional violation of the above statutes and agreed to pay a fine of \$1,000.00, to pay administrative costs of \$53.82, to successfully complete the Board's online laws and rules examination within sixty days, to his license being placed on probation for a period of two years, to immediately provide written notice of his expired license to each person or client for whom he provided engineering services in Louisiana during the period that his license was in an expired status (along with the Louisiana State Fire Marshall's Office), and to the printing of a summary of this matter by name in this publication.

Mr. Christopher G. Tauzin, P.E., a Louisiana licensee, was disciplined by the Board for the offering and/or providing of engineering services in Louisiana during the period that his license was in an expired status from April 1, 2003 until June 1, 2006 in violation of La. R.S. 37:698(A)(9) and (16). Mr. Tauzin's license has been renewed, and he has entered into a Consent Order with the Board, wherein he admitted to an unintentional violation of the above statutes and agreed to pay a fine of \$250.00, to pay administrative costs of \$158.74, to pay past renewals in the amount of \$240.00, to successfully complete the Board's online laws and rules examination within sixty days, and to the printing of a summary of this matter by name in this publication.

Alliance, Inc., a Louisiana licensed engineering firm, was disciplined by the Board for the offering and/or providing of engineering services in Louisiana

during the period that its firm license was in an expired status from October 1, 2005 until September 30, 2006 in violation of La. R.S. 37:698(A)(9) and (16). Alliance, Inc.'s firm license has been renewed, and it has entered into a Consent Order with the Board, wherein it admitted to an unintentional violation of the above statutes and agreed to pay a fine of \$1,000.00, to pay administrative costs of \$230.50, to have its supervising professional successfully complete the Board's online laws and rules examination within sixty days, to the printing of a summary of this matter by name in this publication.

Mr. Michael B. Marie, P.L.S., a Louisiana licensee, was disciplined by the Board for the offering and/or providing of land surveying services in Louisiana during the period that his license was in an expired status from April 1, 2006 until September 25, 2006 in violation of La. R.S. 37:698(A)(9) and (16). Mr. Marie's license has been renewed, and he has entered into a Consent Order with the Board, wherein he admitted to an unintentional violation of the above statutes and agreed to pay a fine of \$250.00, to pay administrative costs of \$115.25, to successfully complete the Board's online laws and rules examination within sixty days, and to the printing of a summary of this matter by name in this publication.

UNLICENSED OFFER AND/OR PRACTICE OF **ENGINEERING AND/OR LAND SURVEYING**

Mr. Emmett L. Jarreau, a non-licensee, was subject to enforcement action by the Board for the unlicensed offering of engineering and/or land surveying services in Louisiana in violation of La. R.S. 37:681 and 700(A)(1). Mr. Jarreau described his business as "Field Engineering and Consulting" in his business card and in a written solicitation listed various engineering and land surveying services offered by him and his company which can only be performed by a professional engineer or professional land surveyor. Mr. Jarreau has entered into a Consent Order with the Board, wherein he admitted to an unintentional violation of the above statutes and agreed to pay a fine of \$1,000.00, to pay administrative costs of \$141.43, to immediately cease and desist any further practice of engineering and/or land surveying in Louisiana and the use of the words "Field Engineering" or other descriptions of engineering and land surveying services in his business card, his correspondence, his written solicitations or otherwise in connection with himself, his company or his work, and to the printing of a summary of this matter by name in this publication.



Mr. Defraites has earned special recognition with many awards from his peers. The Louisiana Engineering Society has





LEO M. ODOM SERVICES TO THE PROFESSION AWARD

The Louisiana Engineering Society Services to the Profession Award will be given as conditions warrant, but not more than annually, for Distinguished Service to the Engineering Profession in Louisiana by a registered Professional Engineer member of the Louisiana Engineering Society, over a period of long duration, in an unselfish manner and in keeping with the highest professional standards of conduct, including active participation and leadership in the technical societies as well as in this and other professional engineering groups. The character, scope and duration of the services rendered are the predominant criteria, rather than strictly engineering or scientific attainments. The desire of the Society is not only to recognize the recipient but to encourage and inspire other engineers to take a greater part in the advancement of the profession in its service to mankind. The award is named in honor of Leo M. Odom, P.E., President of the Society in 1968, active member since 1942, and the award's first recipient.

Jerry G. Lazenby, P.E., P.L.S.

Jerry G. Lazenby, P.E. & P.L.S., is the President of Lazenby & Associates, Inc., Consulting Engineers and Land Surveyors in West Monroe, Louisiana. The purpose of this Award is not only to recognize the recipient's accomplishments and service to the engineering profession, but to encourage and inspire others to volunteer to service the Society and the Profession at the Chapter, State, Regional and National levels.

John J. Plaisance, III, P.E., P.L.S., F.NSPE

John J. Plaisance, II, P. E., L.S., is President of J. Wayne Plaisance, Inc., a general civil engineering and land surveying firm in Galliano, Louisiana. He began his career working in the summers as a rodman and chainman, and then moved up to instrument man, party chief, draftsman, and technician. In 1985, John became a project administrator upon graduation from college. Mr. Plaisance was named President of J. Wayne Plaisance, Inc., upon his father's death in 1988.

The desire of the Society is not only to recognize the recipient, but to encourage and inspire others to take a greater part in the advancement of the Society and its service to mankind. This award is named in honor of Waldemar S. Nelson, P.E., a distinguished member of the Society since 1936.

Ali M. Mustapha, P.E.

Ali M. Mustapha received his Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering from Louisiana Tech University in 1985. He is a registered Professional Civil and Environmental Engineer in Louisiana and a registered Professional Engineer in Arkansas.

Mr. Mustapha started his career as a Project Engineer with Summerlin Associates, a civil engineering consulting firm, in Little Rock, Arkansas. In 1988, he joined the Little Rock Wastewater Utility as a Staff Engineer where he assisted in establishing the Inflow/Infiltration assessment program and the sanitary sewer collection system infrastructure rehabilitation program. In 1990, Mr. Mustapha moved to Shreveport where he was appointed as the City's Drainage Engineer/ Storm water & Floodplain Administrator. While working for the City, Mr. Mustapha was instrumental in creating programs to reduce flooding and improve drainage. In 1992, he established the Flood Prone Property Acquisition Program for the City. The success of the program in Shreveport became a leading model for other municipalities in the state and the region. In 1993, Mr. Mustapha established the City's Storm water Management Program that was created to insure compliance with EPA's Clean Water Act requirements for municipal separate Storm water System (MS4). Shreveport was the first municipality in the State to receive an NPDES permit and create programs to comply with the Clean Water Act regulations. In February of 2001, Mr. Mustapha was appointed as the City's Water, Sewerage & Drainage Chief Engineer. He is responsible for management of the design and construction of drainage, water distribution, and sanitary sewer collection system projects for the City of Shreveport.

Mr. Mustapha has been an active member of the Louisiana Engineering Society since 1990 and has served in all of the Society's elective offices and was elected as LES President for 2003-2004. He also holds memberships in the National Society of Professional Engineers and has served on regional and national committees, the American Society of Civil Engineers, and the Louisiana Floodplain Management Association. He served as President of the Shreveport Branch of ASCE in 2000-2001 and as a Director at Large on the ASCE Louisiana Section Board of Direction. He is currently serving as the Vice President on the Louisiana Section of ASCE Board of Directors. JAMES M. TODD AWARD FOR TECHNOLOGICAL ACCOMPLISHMENT MEDAL

The Louisiana Engineering Society Medal will be awarded as conditions warrant, but not more often than annually, for Distinguished Service by an Engineer for Technological Advancement or Discoveries as contributions to the advancement of Engineering. The purpose of honoring Engineers with this award is to encourage and inspire other engineers to reach even greater heights of professional achievement. The award is named in honor of James M. Todd, P.E., President in 1930 and an active member of the Society until his death in 1971. Mr. Todd suggested the formation of an award for engineering ingenuity in 1950.

Leslie K. Guice, P.E.

Dr. Leslie K. Guice, P.E., is Vice President for Research and Development at Louisiana Tech University. He has been a member of the civil engineering faculty at Louisiana Tech since 1978. Dr. Guice has held several administrative positions, including Head of Civil Engineering and Dean of the College of Engineering and Science. He obtained the B.A. in Architecture and M.S. in Civil Engineering from Louisiana Tech and his Ph.D. from Texas A&M University with a focus in the structures specialty area.

Dr. Guice led in the establishment of two technology-focused research and education centers that are of regional and national importance. The Trenchless Technology Center, established in 1989, has maintained strong industry and government partnerships and has established itself as a leading center in the U.S. for research, education and service in the underground infrastructure field. Dr. Guice also founded the Center for Entrepreneurship and Information Technology as an interdisciplinary center for advancing entrepreneurial research, education, and innovation.

As Dean, Dr. Guice was responsible for all engineering and science academic and research programs. He led the Institute for Micromanufacturing to focus on the emerging field of nanotechnology. With the hiring of nanotechnology faculty in numerous disciplines, further expansion of research laboratories, establishment of an interdisciplinary engineering PhD program, and initiation of a B.S. in Nanosystems Engineering, the University established strong research and education nanotechnology programs that have received national recognition.

As Vice President, Dr. Guice is responsible for the University's research and technology transfer programs. Under his leadership, the University has significantly increased its intellectual property, technology commercialization, and economic development programs, including the University's first technology incubator and start-up com-

Dr. Guice serves as the founding Chair for the Louisiana Optical Network Initiative (LONI) Management Council that includes representatives of all higher education system boards, the Division of Administration, and Louisiana Economic Development. LONI is a highspeed optical grid computing network connecting the state's major research institutions and medical schools.

Dr. Guice and his wife Kathy have three sons, Chad, Kyle and Bret. Dr. Guice is a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers and the American Society for Engineering Education.

The Louisiana Engineering Society Civic Activities Award The Andrew M. Lockett Medal will be awarded as conditions warrant, but not more often than annually, for Distinguished Civic Service by an Engineer, in the interest of the Public, without compensation for those services. The character and scope of the services rendered are the predominant criteria, rather than strictly engineering or scientific attainments. The desire of the Society is not only to recognize the recipient but to encourage and inspire other engineers to take a greater part in the civic well being of their communities, parishes and the State of Louisiana. The award is named in honor of Andrew M. Lockett, P.E., a distinguished member of the Society from 1900 until his death in 1945. Mr. Lockett was a strong advocate for engineers to get involved in civic activities.

Frank P. Gallagher, III, P.E., CIH

Frank P. Gallagher, III, P.E., CIH, has 40 years professional experience. A native of New Orleans Louisiana, he holds baccalaureate and graduate degrees in Civil and Environmental Engineering from the University of Louisiana Lafayette, Clemson University and the University of Texas. He holds professional licenses in Civil and Environmental Engineering and is certified in the practices of industrial hygiene and indoor air quality.

His experience includes a twenty-six year career as a US Air Force officer serving in bioenvironmental and civil engineering capacities both abroad and in the United States. THE A. B. PATERSON AWARD FOR AN ENGINEER IN MANAGEMENT

The Louisiana Engineering Society Engineer-in-Management Award. The A. B. Paterson Medal will be awarded as conditions warrant, but not more often than annually, for Distinguished Service in Management by an Engineer Achievements in management rather than engineering or scientific attainments shall be the primary criteria for the selection of the recipient. The desire of the Society is not only to recognize the recipient but to encourage and inspire other engineers to greater effort in the field of Business Management. The award is named in honor of A. B. Paterson, P.E., and active member of the Society from 1923 until his death in 1952. Mr. Paterson was an engineer, administrator, executive, banker, civic leader and humanitarian.

John W. "Billy" Moore, P.E.

Mr. Moore serves as vice president and Chief Financial Officer of MMLH, Inc., manager of the company's Southern region and manager of the Utility Relocation Team for the Louisiana Department of Transportation TIMED (Transportation Infrastructure Model for Economic Development) Program. He is the direct supervisor of 16 employees, including 4 PE's and 1 PLS. Mr. Moore's previous experience consists of designing or managing over \$14 million in MMLH water, wastewater, gas, drainage and road projects.

As manager of Utility Relocation for LA TIMED Managers, Mr. Moore is directly responsible for relocating utilities that conflict with the widening of roadways included in the \$4.3 billion LA TIMED Program. Under his management, the cost of utility relocation to DOTD is over \$82 million with an estimated \$80 million of additional utility company cost being expended. Mr. Moore's innovative processes within the DOTD regulations include:

- 1. Determining the cost effective method of building a road, including a cost comparison of different road and utility relocation methods.
- 2. Purchasing additional ROW in specific locations to allow the utilities to relocate inside of state ROW instead of requiring the purchase of additional ROW at state cost.
 - 3. Early clearing and grubbing of utility corridors.
- 4. Completing U-drawings, showing the relocated utilities on the roadway plans. This allows all parties to know where each utility will be and leads to early conflict mitigation.
 - 5. Monitoring utility relocation problems and progress.
- 6. Assisting utility companies with paperwork to allow agreements to be executed and relocation to be completed timely.
- 7. Early and frequent communication with the utility companies including meeting with them at least 2 years prior to commencing relocation.
 - 8. Time
- 9. Meeting with major utility companies in the state, including Bellsouth, CLECO, Gulf South Pipeline and Entergy, to discuss the schedule and program.

These innovative team activities have been very popular with the utility companies and the LA TIMED Managers team, and have assisted with the success of the TIMED program. Mr. Moore received the 2005 Louisiana TIMED Managers Choice Award for Employee of the Year in recognition of his efforts.

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
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DISTRICT 4 SEMINAR UPDATE

District 04 hosted an 8 hour seminar on January 12, 2007, and over 65 registered participants from districts around the state were present. The seminar included presentations on Elevations, by Carl Watts of FEMA, an NGS update on Bench Marks in Louisiana, by Denis Riordan, and John Evans, PLS of the La. State Land Office, presented the history of the boundary between Louisiana and Texas. As a surprise presentation, Ms. Nita Cole of the Louisiana State Exhibit Museum brought a bottle that had been used to mark the center of a mound constructed on the boundary. This bottle was placed in 1841 as part of a joint survey by the United States and the Republic of Texas. It was recovered in 1941 by the Louisiana Geodetic Survey during a retracement, and given to the Shreveport Historical Society. As a door prize, a print of an artists' depiction of the 1841 survey party was donated by Dan Hampton, a PLS from Texas.

A New Era in GPS Surveying is Coming: Are You Ready?

New GPS signals are coming. In a clear demonstration of its commitment to civilian users, the U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) has timetabled a plan for modernizing its constellation of GPS satellites.
