The respondent has signed and returned the proposed consent order offered by the Complaint Review Committee. The proposed consent order contained the following sanctions:

38 Committee. The proposed consent order contained the following sanctions:

56 Mr. Knotts presented the Liaison and Law Review Committee's recommendations to  
57 (a) send the proposed letter to the Louisiana Attorney General seeking an opinion  
58 from regarding the application of La. R.S. 37:3651(A) to the Board's professional  
59 engineer licensure requirements and (b) amend Rules 1509 and Rule 2701.

62 and Law Review Committee to send the proposed letter to the Louisiana Attorney  
63 General seeking an opinion regarding the application of La. R.S. 37:3651(A) to the

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66 After discussion, the Board unanimously approved the motion made by the Liaison  
67 and Law Review Committee to amend Rule 1509 to read as follows:  
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69 §1509. Experience at Time of Application

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A. ...

B. For applicants for professional engineer licensure under §903.A.1 of these rules, the “verifiable record of four years or more of progressive experience obtained subsequent to meeting the educational and applicable experience qualifications to be an engineer intern” must be gained by the time of application for licensure. However, for any such applicant who has already been duly certified as an engineer intern by the board and has received approval to take the examination in the principles and practice of engineering under §1305.B of these rules, such experience need not be gained by the time of application for licensure part I, rather such experience need only be gained by the time of application for licensure part II.

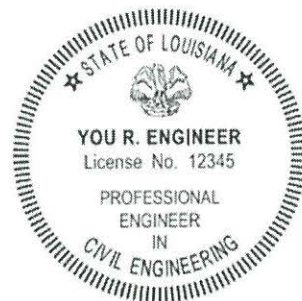
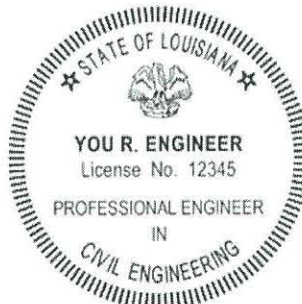
C. For applicants for professional land surveyor licensure under §909.A.1 of these rules, the “verifiable record of four years or more of combined office and field experience in land surveying including two years or more of progressive experience on land surveying projects under the supervision of a professional land surveyor” must be gained by the time of application for licensure.

After discussion, the Board unanimously approved the motion made by the Liaison and Law Review Committee to amend Rule 2701 to read as follows:

§2701. Seal and Signature

A.1. - A.2.f. ...

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A.3. - A.5.b. ...

Mr. Ducote and Mr. Hyatt exited the meeting at 9:25 a.m.

Chairman Thompson appointed an ad hoc committee, comprised of Richard Savoie (chair), Mr. Phillips and Mr. Crosby, and charged it with reviewing Rule 1505(B) regarding engineering work experience and reporting to the Board at the November Board meeting.

The Board recessed at 9:35 a.m. and resumed at 9:55 a.m.

## **Applications**

### **Application Appeals**

The Board reviewed the appeal letter from Colonel James **Griffin** concerning the reviewing committee decision to disapprove his application for licensure as a professional engineer as a military-trained applicant under Rule 903(B)(1).

After discussion, the Board unanimously approved the motion made by Mr. Patterson, seconded by Mr. Krouse, to notify Mr. Griffin that (a) the Board is still reviewing his appeal, (b) his application was initially denied based on his multiple failures of the PE exam and (c) the Board has requested an opinion from the Louisiana Attorney General to help the Board better evaluate applications such as his.

## **Committee Reports (continued)**

### **Finance Committee**

Mr. Patterson presented the financial documents for the Board to review.

The Board unanimously approved the motion made by the Finance Committee to renew the certificate of deposit at Neighbors Bank when it matures on October 16, 2015.

## **Old Business**

Mr. Krouse reported on office security. The Louisiana Engineering Foundation would be responsible for installing an awning at the Board's front door and cameras at the five exterior doors of the building. The Board would be responsible for installing an awning at the Board's back door and a mail slot at the Board's front door. Both items would need to be approved by the Louisiana Engineering Foundation before installation.

After discussion, the Board approved the motion made by the ad hoc committee comprised of Mr. Krouse, Mr. Phillips and Mr. Patterson, with Mr. Krouse abstaining, to allocate the amount of \$4,500 to complete the installation of the awning at the Board's back door and the mail slot at the Board's front door.

At 11:15 a.m., members of the Louisiana Council of Engineering Deans (LCED) entered the meeting to meet with the Board: Dr. Nicholas Altiero (Tulane); Dr. Judy Wornat (LSU); Dr. Emir Jose Macari (New Orleans); Dr. Mark Zappi, P.E. (UL-Lafayette); and Dr. Hisham Hegab, P.E. (Louisiana Tech).

## **Closing Business**

The Board unanimously approved the motion made by Mr. Crosby, seconded by Mr. Krouse, to approve all committee recommendations and actions.

The Board unanimously approved the motion made by Mr. Patterson, seconded by Mr. Carroll, to acknowledge and confirm all licenses and certificates issued by the Board.

The Board unanimously approved the motion made by Mr. Krouse, seconded by Mr. Knotts, to approve all Board expenses.


The Board unanimously approved the motion made by Mr. Crosby, seconded by Mr. Carroll, to adjourn.
